2017 President's Letter

Dear Friends of Old Westbury Gardens,

Country houses represent an essential aspect of American history and Old Westbury Gardens is truly remarkable as one of the few that remain intact, retaining not only Westbury House and the gardens, but also its furnishings and works of art. Our commitment to protecting Long Island's most significant historic landmark is unwavering and a long range strategic plan has set in motion key initiatives that will ensure Old Westbury Gardens will be preserved for generations to come.

This year the Gardens completed Phase II of the restoration of the South Allée. This character defining feature was originally designed as a three-tiered planting - a Hemlock Hedge, Flowering Dogwoods, and towering European Lindens as the overstory. While the Lindens remain in pristine condition, the Dogwoods were in

A three-year effort was launched to replace the Hedge and plant hundreds of new Dogwoods. The project will be completed in spring 2018, and visitors will be enchanted to see the South Allée restored to its original splendor with the new Hedge and a profusion of pink and white Flowering Dogwoods alongside the majestic Lindens. As a result of this preservation effort, Old Westbury Gardens was awarded the prestigious Garden Club of America New York State Historic Preservation Commendation.

Also being completed this year is the restoration of the Service Wing Portico and Courtyard at Westbury House. An addition to Westbury House in 1911, the Service Wing was the main entrance for domestic operations. The original portico was removed in the 1970's due to structural instability, and thanks to generous donors we are now restoring this important façade of Westbury House. The Service Wing entrance will serve as a hub for expanded house tours and community programming in 2018.

The Gardens has been in the planning phase to replace the 111 year old roof of Westbury House. Our roof, sheathed in Collyweston slate, is the only one of its kind in the United States. While procuring the original slate material last year, we learned that the mine, that had provided slate for illustrious buildings in the U.K. for 600 years, had been closed for 60 years and there were no other sources available. After I visited the Collyweston region last spring, we were excited to learn that in January 2017, the mine reopened and the Gardens can now proceed with the restoration of this unique and distinctive roof.

As we continue to enhance our preservation efforts, the Gardens expanded youth education outreach and developed creative new public programs designed to deepen appreciation and raise awareness of our historically significant site. In 2017, Old Westbury Gardens welcomed over 7,500 children, many of whom participated in our Environmental Education program designed to enrich the science concepts taught in the classroom. Our beautifully preserved site becomes an

outdoor classroom where children can explore and learn about the natural world.

Preservation News

What happens when a great American country house is missing a character defining element such as a staircase or porch? It usually goes unnoticed after a long absence and eventually "disappears" from everyday consciousness.



The Service Wing portico restoration at the east elevation of Westbury House is a revelation of scale and design intent. Architect Horace Trumbauer's exacting blueprints provide the concept of how the servant's entrance should appear but it's often difficult to envision the actual outcome. As the sleek wood columns were erected on the existing brick and bluestone terrace, visitors and staff expressed surprise at how imposing the structure was going to be. It is a very formal feature of the Service Wing courtyard. There is a pleasing symmetry in comparing the main entrance of Westbury House to the restored servant's entrance. The proportions of the limestone columns that flank either side of the main entrance create a stately formality designated for family and guests while the grouping of the servant's entrance wood columns possess a similar heft. It was typical of country house construction that less costly materials and simpler designs be used for service wings - thus plain Doric capitals for the service wing columns and more elaborate ionic ones at the front entrance. Even the servant's wing cornice which appears to be stone is wood painted to resemble limestone. The message is clear, this is the service wing of Westbury

House and the modest materials tell us this is where the help carried out the back of house tasks.

The courtyard paving is also being restored. The original buff pavers which are marked "Toledo" are no longer in production. The pavers, still in good condition, have been carefully salvaged to be used in other areas of the Gardens. Available pavers of the same proportions and coloration are not being produced and a compromise was made to procure pavers with as many of the same characteristics as possible.

Upon completion, the east elevation of Westbury House will be intact and the 1911 composition of Servant's Wing Portico, Courtyard and Laundry Building will once again reflect the vision of the original estate.

Horticulture News

Many of our visitors think that this is a slow time in the Horticulture Department. However, this November has already been very busy out in the gardens. Tens of thousands of bulbs have been planted for this coming spring. Tulips, hyacinths, daffodils, fritillaria, and other species will be gracing the borders while thousands of minor bulbs such as bluebells and squill will add to the naturalized bulb displays in our woodlands.



In addition to all of our bulb planting we have also begun work on the third and final phase of our South Allée Restoration. We took delivery of one hundred and fifty hemlocks this November that we will keep heeled in until they are ready to plant this spring. When we complete this planting we will have restored over one thousand linear feet of hemlock hedge. This is the largest restoration project that we have ever undertaken in the gardens.

While much of December is taken up with holiday decorating and putting the gardens to bed, January and February is the time when the horticulture staff will do most of the pruning on our many flowering shrubs. By the time March approaches, we will already be ready to prune the roses and get the gardens ready for opening again. The work in a garden is never done!
